

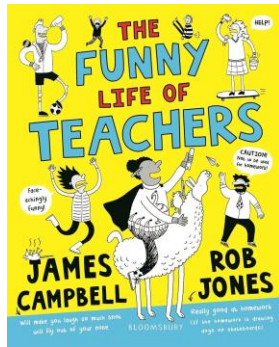

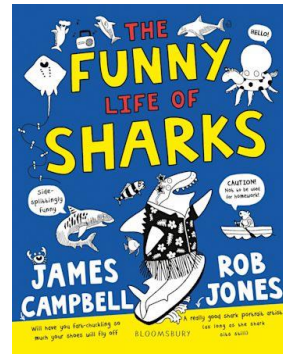
Reading Newsletter

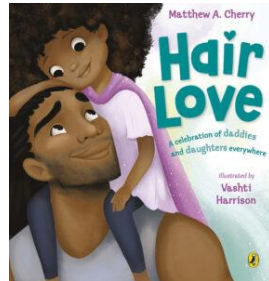

Hair Love by Matthew Cherry

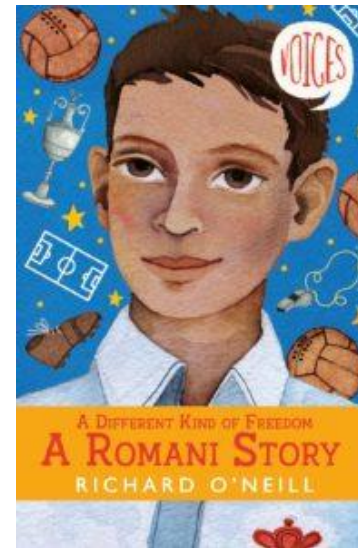
