The summer term is always a busy one filled with lots of lovely activities and experiences to support your child's learning and development. It is also the term where we begin the transition process to ensure your child is ready for the next stage in their learning journey.

Monday 30th May to Friday 3rd June <u>Stay and Play:</u> We are so pleased to be able to begin offering our stay and play sessions again. After half term, we will be inviting you to come and join us to take part in a range of lovely activities with your child. More information to follow nearer the time.

<u>*Warmer Weather:*</u> Children spend lots of their day playing in our outside area. Now that the weather is getting warmer please ensure you send them with a sun hat that is clearly named and apply sun cream before they come to school. We will provide and apply sun cream to top up through the day but if your child has any allergies please speak to your child's teacher and send in their own sun cream with their name on.

Children can also come in in either grey shorts or blue school summer dresses.

Phonics: The introduction of the Little Wandle phonics scheme has gone really well and the children are enjoying the daily sessions. Reception will continue to upload the phonics newsletter on to Tapestry, which highlights what the children will be learning in class each week. The new phonemes/digraphs (sounds) are displayed on the newsletter and we would encourage you to practice these with your child at home. Some of the newsletters may have a different term for the date, due to us only just starting the scheme over the last half term.
